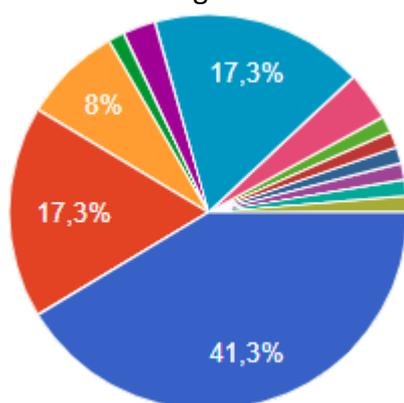
RESULTS OF THE BELGIAN ONLINE SURVEY

The survey ran during 5 weeks from August 3rd to Sept 7th on the Flemish speaking side, getting 75 answers, while it run only 2 weeks on the French speaking side from Sept 3 to 20 with 40 answers. Overall the results of this survey are based on 115 respondents which represent a little more than 10% of the Belgian membership with an equal ratio of members/respondents in every ICOM Belgium sub-committee.

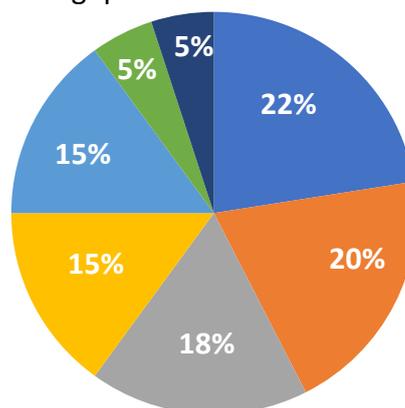

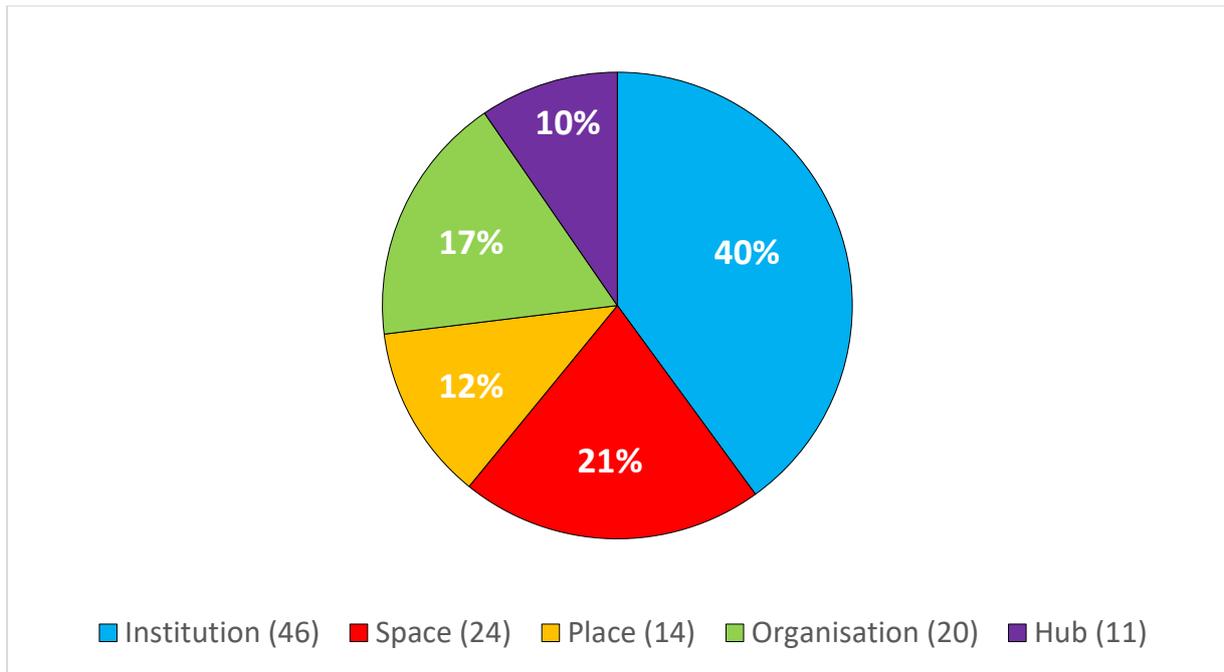

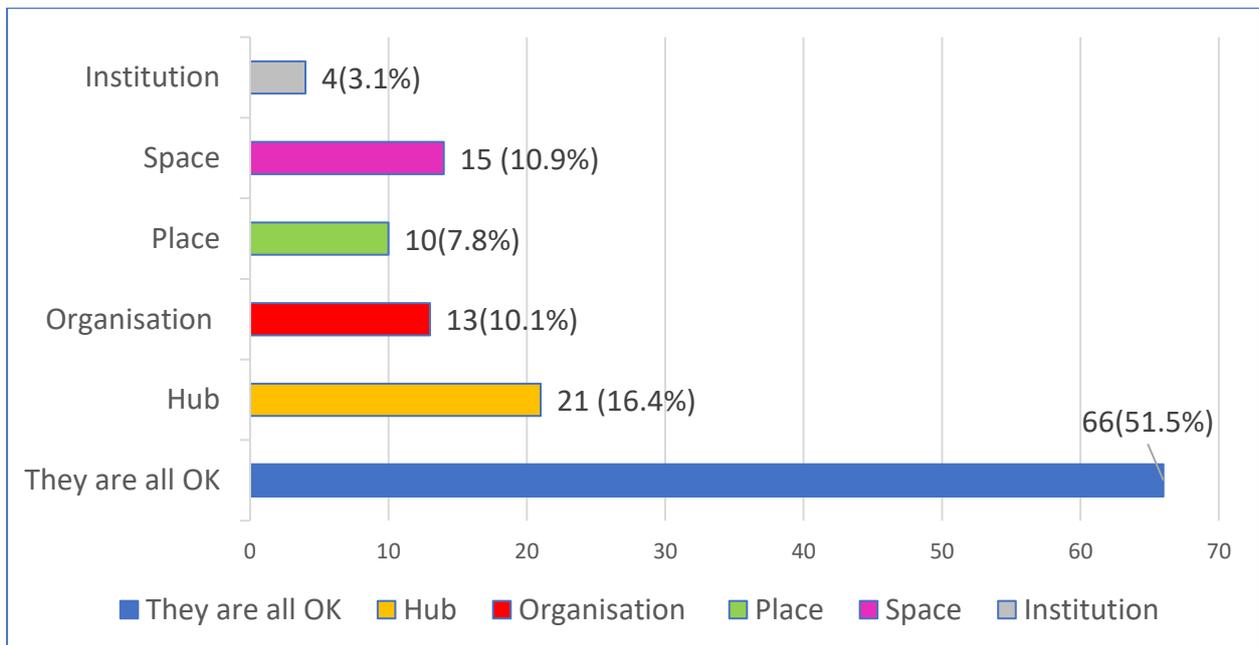

1.4. SUMMARY ICOM BELGIUM FLANDERS

There is no clear preference for one or another key concept, they all have their pros and cons. A small majority of the ICOM Belgium Flanders members voted for 'institution' (29,3%). Space (24%) and organization (21,3%) are close runners up.

Institution also got the most votes on the second question (12%) and raises some opposition. But so do all the other terms, although less: space (5,3%) and organization (1,3%).

Based on the figures and the remarks of the recipients, the suggested key concepts can be divided into two groups.

The more formal names (institution, organization) combined take up half of the votes, and are popular in larger museums, or museums which are part of a larger (legal/bureaucratic) whole, e.g. municipal museums, or federal museums.

The three other terms (space, place and hub) combined got the other half of the votes, and are favored by smaller, more informal museums, based on voluntary associations, commons' initiatives, ... But these key concepts also raised some opposition: they are too general, too broad.

In conclusion, this seems to be the question that was most open to debate: the majority prefers 'institution', but it was also the key concept with the most opposition. However, all key concepts got some opposition, confirming the difference of opinion between larger, more formal museums and smaller and less formally organized ones.

1.5. SUMMARY ICOM BELGIQUE WALLONIE-BRUXELLES

There is a clear preference for "institution" (60%), followed by "place" (15) and "space" (12%), organization (10%) and finally "hub" (3%). When discussed institution seemed to "academic" and "space" has been preferred. "Organization" although perceived as neutral has been discarded because it's not "precise" enough for a museum and too "business-like".

Hub has been clearly rejected both in the survey and by the meeting participants and this is the only term that French speaking participants do not want to appear in a definition because it doesn't mean anything and refer better to a transportation system than anything else.

1.6. SUMMARY ICOM BELGIUM

Institution is clearly the preferred term to use when referring to a museum (40%). **Hub** is the least preferred and the most rejected (21%), way before other ones that may be perceived as too neutral, unprecise or exclusive of other forms of museums such as the digital ones in the case of "place"

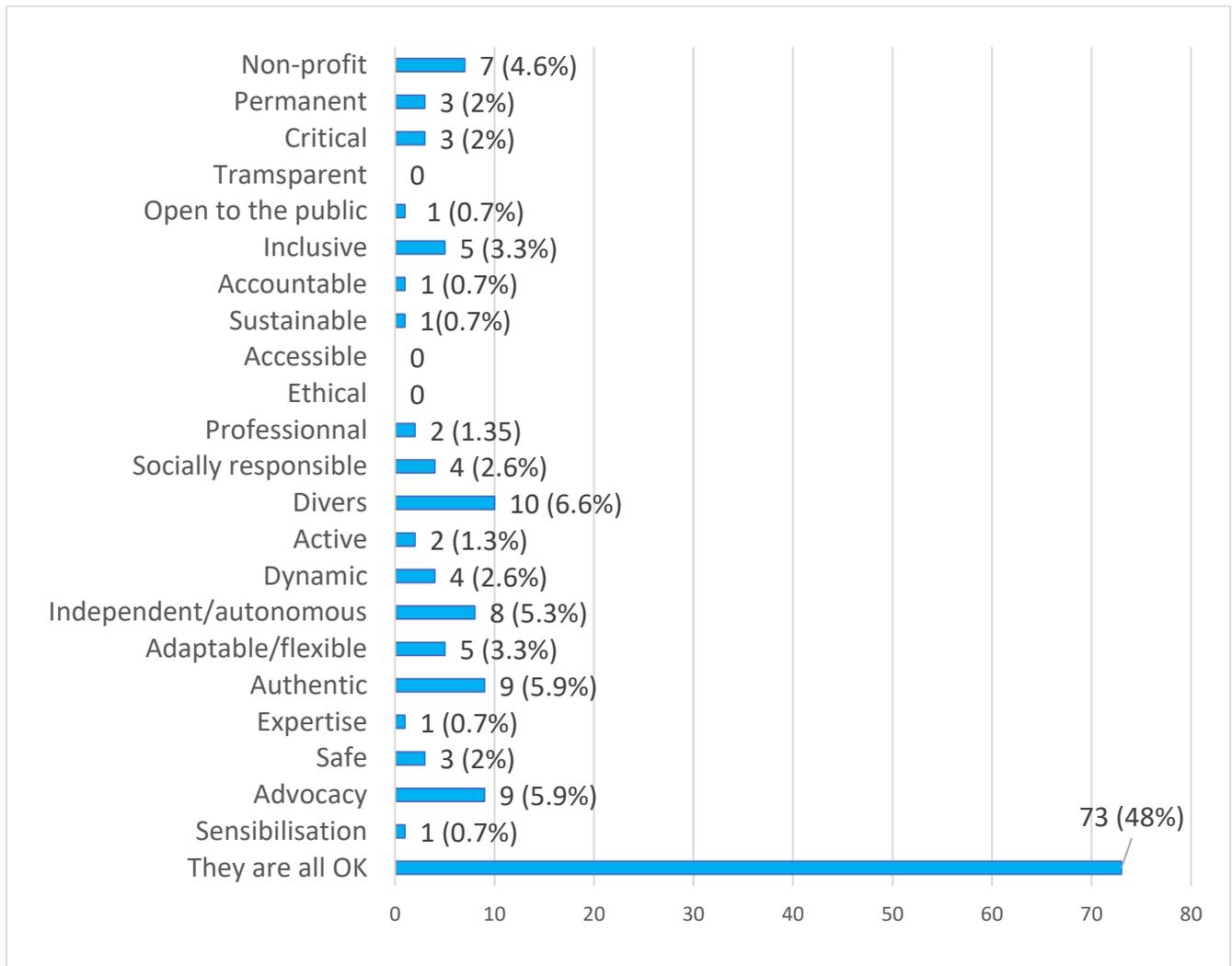

2.4. SUMMARY ICOM BELGIUM FLANDERS

Based on the weighed votes (first choice gets 5 points, ...), this is the preference from the ICOM Belgium Flanders members:

1. Open to the public
2. Inclusive
3. Permanent
4. Non-profit
5. Expertise

The terms that received the most opposition are:

- Advocacy (12,7%): is seen as a contradiction with independent and neutral; advocacy can be dangerous, could be politically manipulated;
- Independent/autonomous (5,6%): dubious term, could be interpreted in the wrong way; a lot of museums are part of a greater structure (government, cultural organization, ...)
- Non-profit (5,6%)
- Authentic (4,2%)

In conclusion, apart from non-profit, which is both a popular choice and also a concept that raises questions by a small group, the preferred concepts here are clear.

None of the ICOM Belgium Flanders members voted for the concept of 'advocacy', and this is also the concept with the most opposition. It can be a valid mission for some museums, but we strongly feel that it should not be incorporated into the museum definition itself.

2.5. SUMMARY ICOM BELGIQUE WALLONIE-BRUXELLES

The French speaking participants favored clearly

1. Open to the public
2. Non-profit
3. Permanent
4. Critical
5. Either "responsible" (ranked by 1st, 2nd, etc choices) or "expertise" (weighed ranking)

It is surprising that "accessible" hasn't been chosen, but participants said that this notion is included in the previous question and choice of "open to the public" that means: without restriction nor discrimination.

There is no term that shows absolute limitations, but a couple of them seem to be somewhat problematic. Among them is the biased translation of the English word "advocacy" into "sensibilisation" in French that doesn't mean the same thing. When referring to the French meeting it is clear that "advocacy" is absolutely rejected as a concept for qualifying a museum

The terms that got the most opposition are those perceived as involving a political and social activism such as "socially responsible" "active", as well as those considered as unprecise such as "authentic", "adaptable", "diverse", "safe"; and finally those that are most of the time not applicable such as "independent".

However the group discussions in both ICOM Belgium sections show that most attendants criticized a lot the “socio-political” aspects of some terms, and preferred by far the concept of “expertise” to qualify a museum

The steering group of the Define process in ICOM Belgium proposes therefore the following words:

- 1. Open to the public**
- 2. Permanent**
- 3. Non-profit**
- 4. Inclusive**
- 5. Expertise**

The terms that are getting most opposition are:

- Diverse (10%) which is unprecise (is it targeting the public, the exhibitions or the museum professionals?) and redundant with “open to the public”
- Authentic (9%): authenticity is an illusion from a social or political point of view and most of museums do not display “authentic” objects...
- Advocacy (9%) again is perceived as “dangerous” and politically manipulated
- Independant/Autonomous (8%) for nobody, nor any organisation is “independant” nor “autonomous”...
- Non-profit (7%). This term is probably misunderstood for “unable to generate profit” wich is not the case, but any profit should be reinvested in the museun and cannot be shared by the owners... however this concept appeared already high in the second Belgian survey, so there is the possibility that Belgian professionnall envision in the future the inclusion of for-profit museums within the ICOM community.

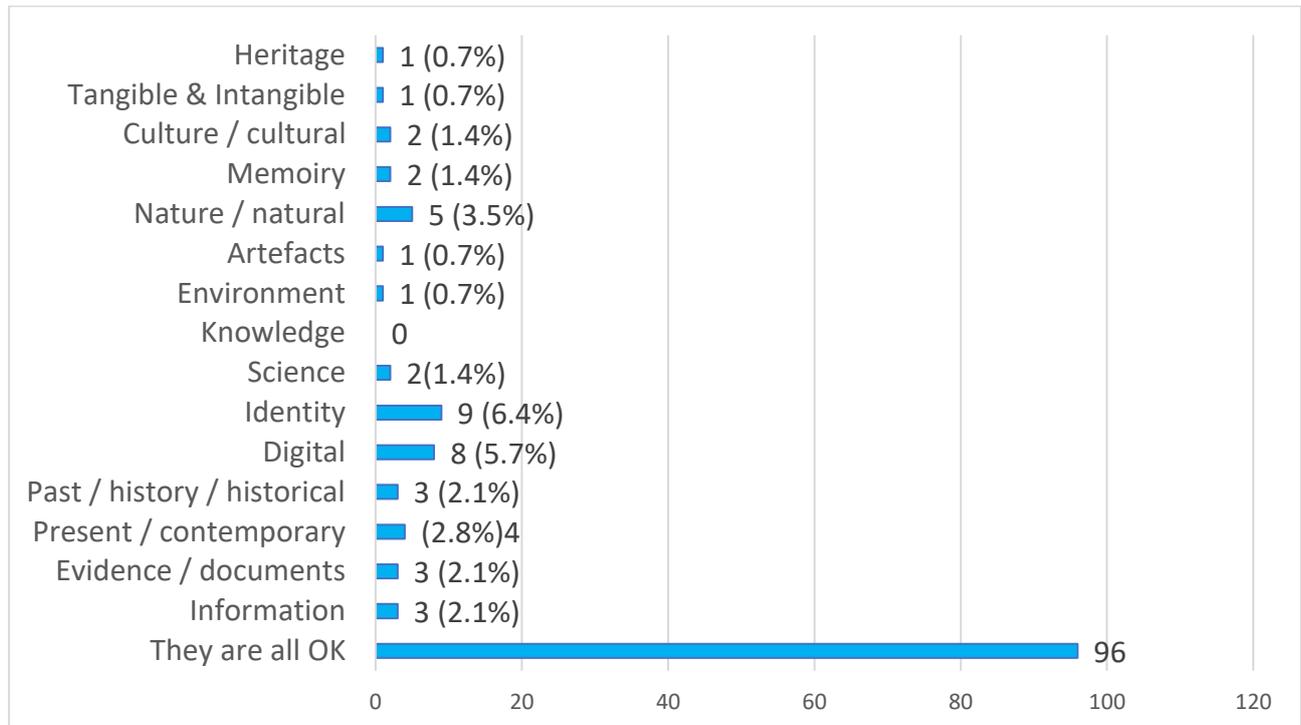

Some suggestions have been made but they haven't been discussed nor chosen by several participants, and some suggested terms are found elsewhere in the survey.

3.4. SUMMARY ICOM BELGIUM FLANDERS

Based on the weighed votes (first choice gets 5 points, ...), this is the preference from the ICOM Belgium Flanders members:

1. Heritage
2. Knowledge
3. Tangible & intangible
4. Culture/cultural
5. Artefacts

The terms that got the most opposition were:

- Identity (6,7%): concept with a lot of connotations, very sensitive; it is perceived as a political concept; dangerous to incorporate this into the museum definition
- Science (2,7%): not applicable to all museums
- Nature/natural (2,7%): not applicable to all museums

3.5 SUMMARY ICOM BELGIQUE WALLONIE-BRUXELLES

The French speaking participants favored (ranked by weight):

1. Heritage
2. Culture / cultural
3. Tangible & intangible
4. Knowledge
5. Memory

However when ranked by 1st, 2nd, etc choices "memory" is replaced by "artefacts" showing then the same pattern as the Dutch speaking participants.

The terms with most oppositions are

- digital (10%) because it is a mean but not an object and scarcely a subject.
- identity(7%) because it is politically sensitive and dangerous, and not objective at all. It is a political term and is therefore manifold, used and abused by many and causes polarization

However the group discussions in ICOM Belgium Flanders shows that Memory was a complete "no-go" because of its potential political issues, such as in the "contested memories" discussions. For ICOM Belgique Wallonie-Bruxelles, Memory does not show such an opposition but it hasn't been chosen neither by the discussion group nor in the survey. Despite the fact that Artefact was perceived as exclusive for the natural sciences it is included in the numbered ranking and comes just after memory in what weighed ranking

The steering group of the Define process in ICOM Belgium proposes therefore the following words:

- 1. Heritage**
- 2. Culture / cultural**
- 3. Tangible & Intangible**
- 4. Knowledge**
- 5. Artefacts**

The terms that are getting by far most opposition are:

- Identity, because it is politically sensitive and dangerous, and not objective at all. It is a political term and is therefore manifold used and abused by many and causes polarisation
- Digital, because it is a mean but not an object and scarcely a subject

Other terms show some opposition from respondents, such as "science", "nature", "present", "past", etc because they cannot apply to all museums.

There was a mistake in the French on-line survey for it was possibly to choose only 5 terms when it was actually asked to provide 6 terms. After a thorough analysis, it appears that this mistake didn't bring any bias in the overall results.

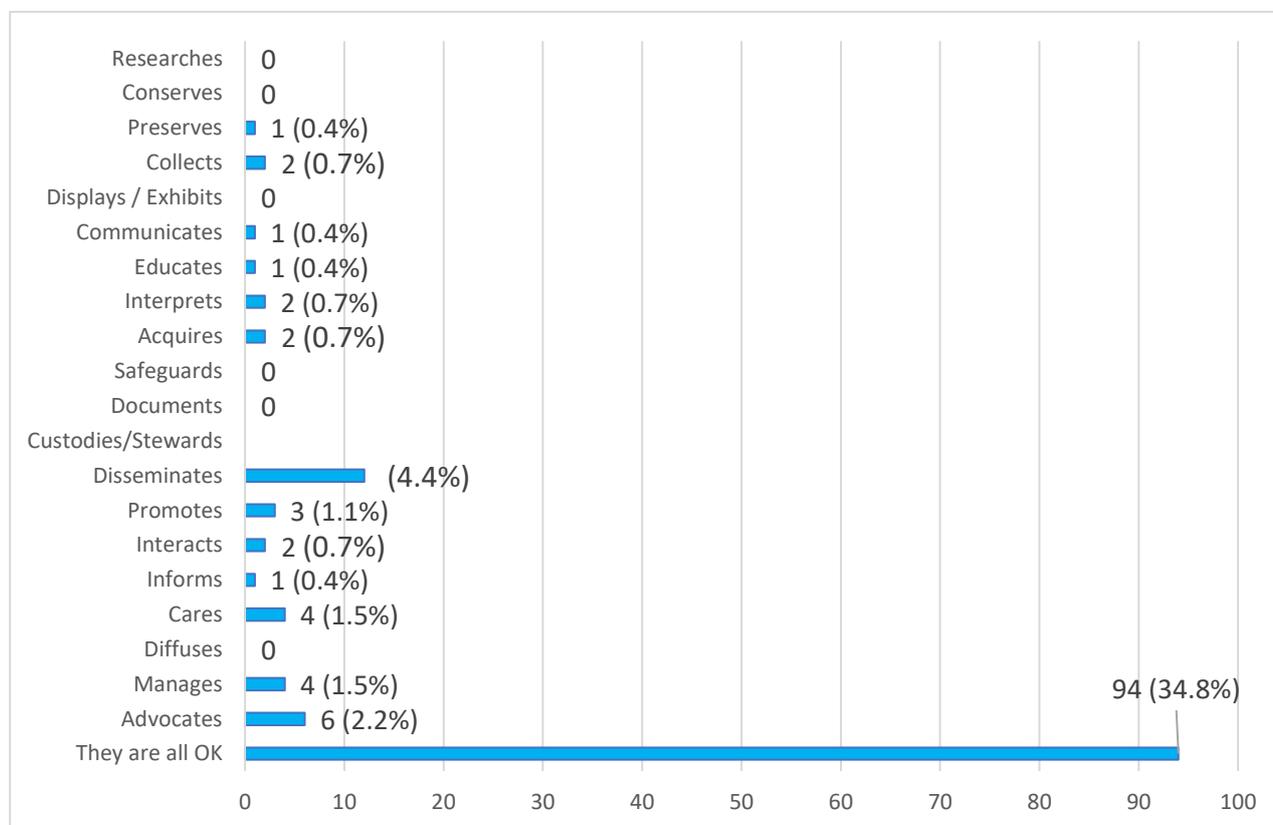

4.3. Additions: Would you suggest including any additional particular term among those that qualifies a museum ?

Some suggestions have been made but some haven't been discussed. However some are proposed by several participants:

- Transmits is better than interpret. Transmits englobes several actions: educates, promotes, raise awareness
- Enriches
- Vulgarizes (make accessible) / Valorizes
- Distributes instead of disseminates with a sens of sharing
- Mediates /engages / facilitate (x3)
- Participation
- Engage/invites instead of interacts

Based on the weighed votes (first choice gets 6 points, ...), this is the preference from the ICOM Belgium Flanders members:

1. Displays/exhibits
2. Collects
3. Researches
4. Preserves
5. Educated
6. Conserves

The term that got the most opposition was 'advocates' (8%): some museums should be politically neutral, this is a big no from them

4.5. SUMMARY ICOM BELGIQUE WALLONIE-BRUXELLES

The French speaking participants favored (ranked by weight):

1. Displays/exhibits
2. Conserves
3. Researches
4. Preserves
5. Advocates
6. Communicates

But because of the translation mistake, the choice of advocate should be understood as "raise awareness", "make aware of"

The term that got the most opposition is :

- disseminates (21%), probably because few participants understood its real meaning.

But it was clear during the discussion that "advocate" was a completely rejected term because of its subjective political implication.

However the group discussions in both ICOM Belgium sections show that most attendants criticized the proximity of the meanings of some words, such as conserves, preserves and safeguards.

The steering group of the Define process in ICOM Belgium proposes therefore the following words:

- 1. Displays / Exhibits**
- 2. Researches**
- 3. Conserves/preserves**
- 4. Collects**
- 5. Educates**

And as sixth word, suggests to add “mediates / engages / facilitates” that received support by several respondents.

- 6. mediates / engages / facilitates**

The terms that are getting by far most opposition is “disseminates”, probably because of an understanding issue of the term, and because it is a synonym of communicates. Then “advocates” and finally “manages” are somewhat rejected.

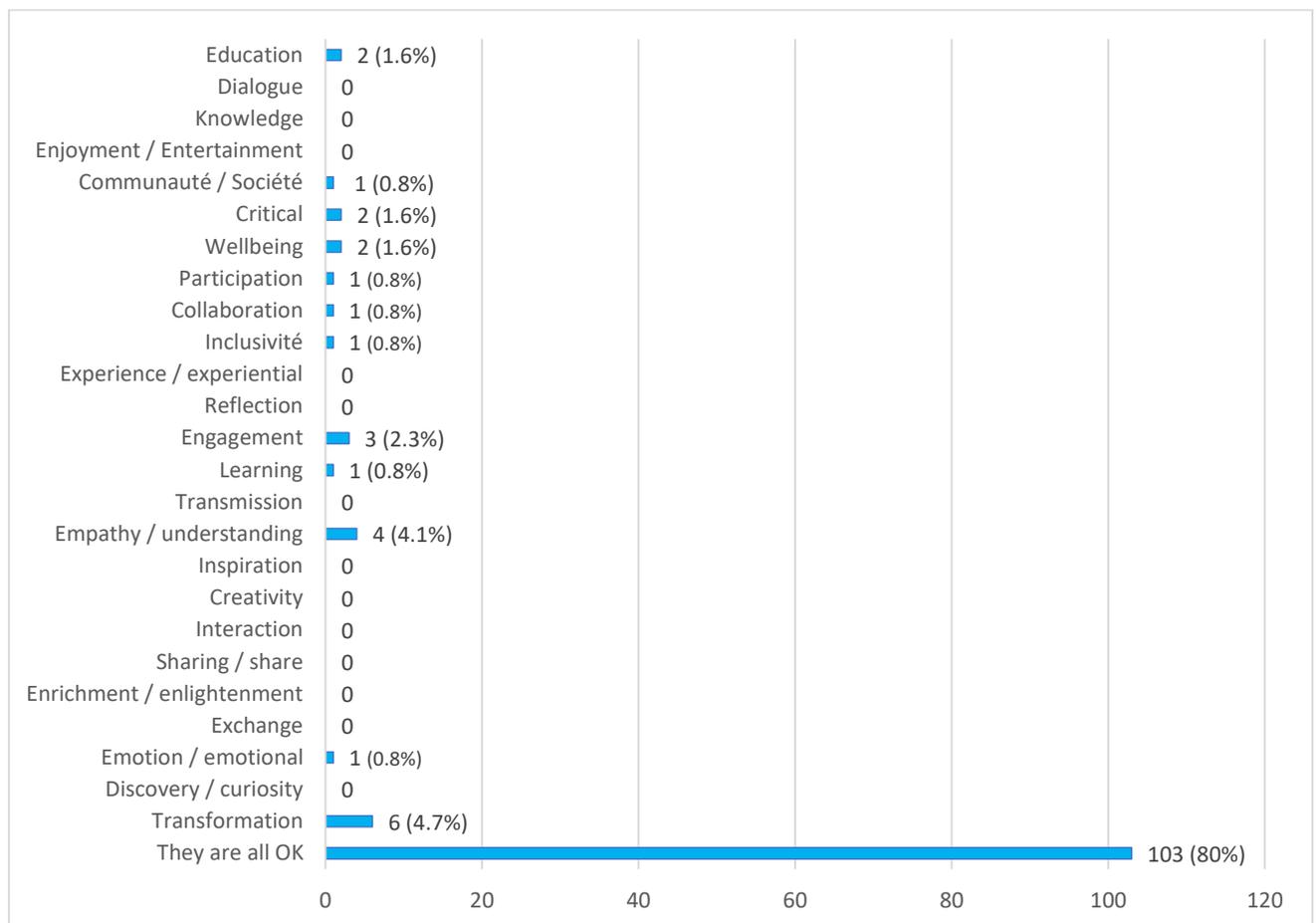

A great majority stated that all terms were ok (97,3%). There were no clear issues with the terms above.

- Empathy/understanding (9%): from whom, to whom. Vague-
- Wellbeing (4.5%) because a museum is not a SPA

- 4. Enrichment/enlightenment**
- 5. Reflection**

80% of participants think that none of the proposed terms have a limitation, except maybe for “tranformation” (5%) and empathy/understanding (4%)

6 VI- SOCIAL VALUES: What values shape museums

6.1. Preferred key concepts. Please select SIX that you find most appropriate

Two errors occurred in the French online questionnaire: 1) only 5 choices were possible to indicate while the survey asked for 6 terms. After analysis, the 6th choice is of such little importance that it does not influence the selection. 2) Two terms: “diversity” and “future” have been merged into one “Future diversity”. Did this influence the answers? This is possible, but if we refer to the discussions and responses at the September 14 French speaking meeting, these two terms are neither commented, nor chosen, nor rejected. They therefore seem to have little importance in the choice of keywords. And their number account only for 40 on 135 answers.

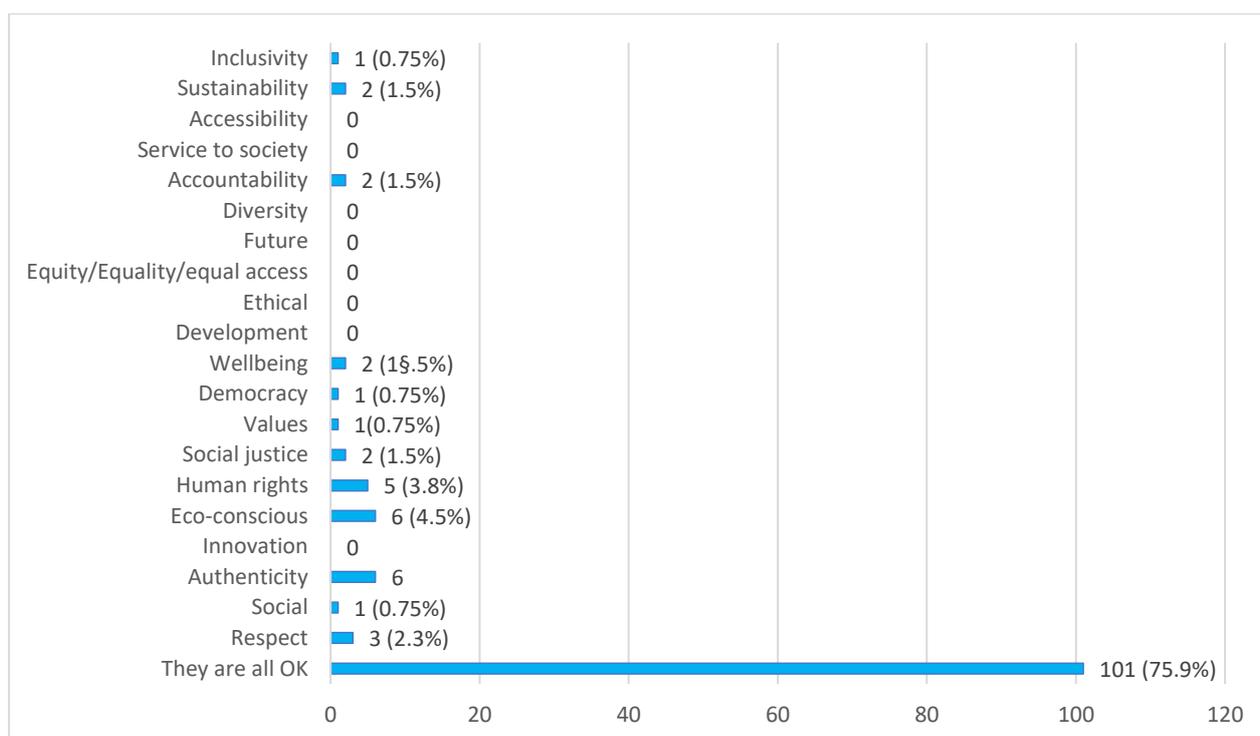

- Critical / scientific thinking: the trust in museums lies in the fact that we are expected to be presented with the state of the art of knowledge, this cannot be done without a critical scientific work behind

In turn "sustainability" in its three aspects (people, planet, profit) came forward systematically and is ranked ex-aequo with Ethical and just 1 point from Authenticity

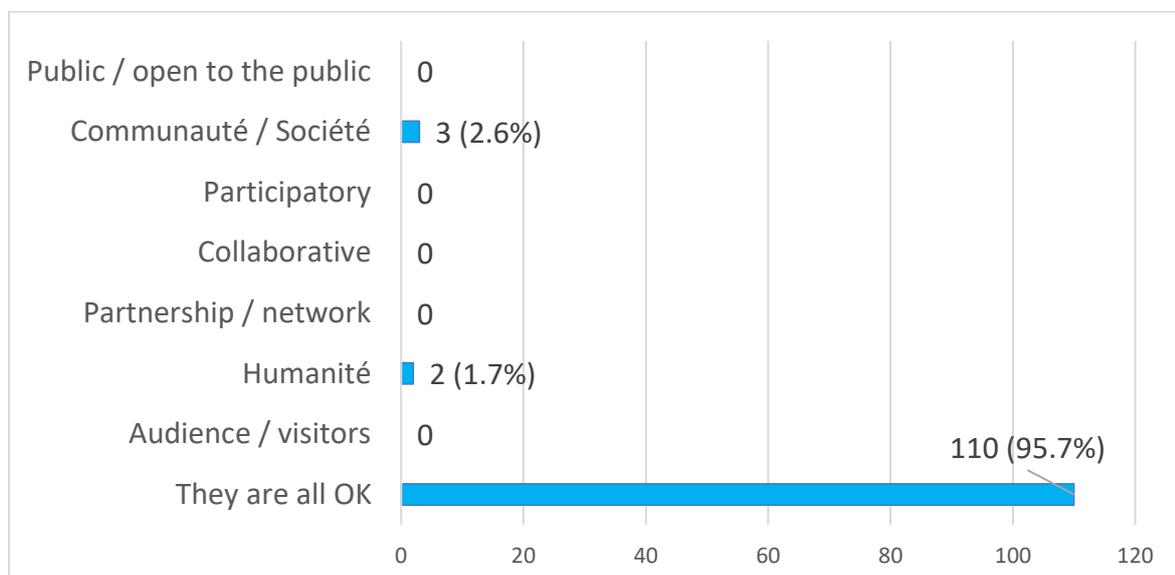
